LESSON 7 – THE FEAST OF UNLEAVENED BREAD/ ""

i "And on the fifteenth day of the same month is the feast of unleavened bread unto the Lord: seven days ye must eat unleavened bread." – Leviticus 23:6

"Your glorying is not good. Know ye not that a little leaven leaveneth the whole lump? Purge out therefore the old leaven, that ye may be a new lump, as ye are unleavened. For even Christ our passover is sacrificed for us:" – I Corinthians 5:6-7

The Feast of Unleavened Bread is a picture of the current Church Age. Christ said at the institution of the Lord's Supper, "For as often as ye eat this bread, and drink this cup, ye do shew the Lord's death **till he come.**" At that point, we exit the church age and enter the tribulation period. So, for now, we the church and as Christians, already saved by the blood (Passover), strive to live without sin (leaven) remembering the symbolism of the Old Testament Feasts and Offerings along the way but knowing the literal fulfillment of them all by Christ on the cross of Calvary.

Key Terms and Thoughts

Passover	The major Jewish spring festival which commemorates the deliverance of the Israelites from Egyptian slavery.
Leaven	A substance used to product fermentation in dough and make it rise. In bible times, leaven was usually a piece of fermented dough retained from a previous baking that was placed in the new dough to cause it to rise.
Lord's Supper	That which the Lord instituted to commemorate His death.
